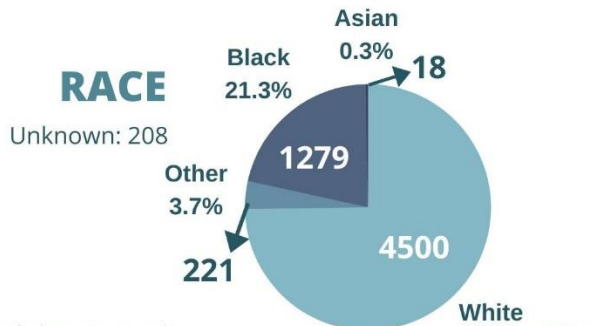
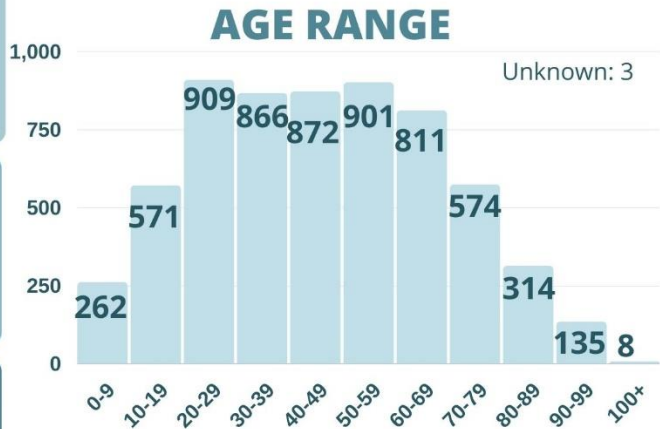
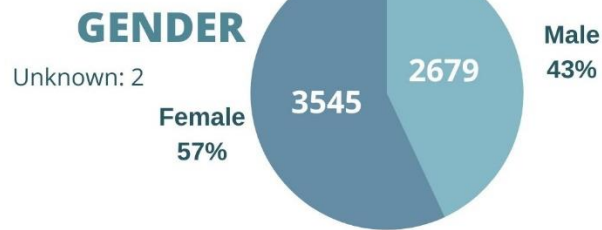

We, the members of the Joint Crisis Communication Team, are extremely saddened to announce the passing of ten Macon County residents with COVID-19. These residents were:

- Two males and two females in their 70s
- Three males and two females in their 80s
- One male in his 90s

We ask that you please respect the privacy of their families and friends as they mourn their incredible losses.

When you see the numbers of cases, hospitalizations and deaths of your fellow community members, we beg of you to put yourselves in their shoes and the shoes of those who love them. These are HUMAN BEINGS just like you. These are members of our community who have families and friends, and they have lives that are changed, sometimes forever, by COVID-19. We ask you to take the path of selflessness, to consider those you do not know and likely will never meet, when carrying out your daily lives and making plans for the immediate future while we continue to battle this worldwide pandemic. It is a thankless task, but our community will come out stronger, better and more resilient as a result of your selflessness.

Today, the Joint CCT is reporting 77 newly-confirmed cases of COVID-19. Therefore, since the start of the pandemic, the total number of confirmed COVID-19 cases in Macon County residents is 6,226. Please acknowledge that every person affected by this pandemic is a human being with family, friends, and a future that is changed by COVID-19. It is up to every single member of this community to do EVERYTHING that they can do prevent the spread of this virus and the consequences associated.
