As of today's release, the Joint Crisis Communication Team (CCT) reports the following numbers:





The Joint Crisis Communication Team is incredibly saddened to announce the passing of four Macon County residents with COVID-19. These residents were:

- One male and one female in their 60s.
- One female in her 70s.
- One female in her 80s.

We ask that you please respect the privacy of his family and friends as they mourn their incredible loss.

Today, the Joint CCT is reporting 58 newly-confirmed cases of COVID-19. Please note that while there are 58 newly-confirmed cases today, it was determined through case investigations that three of the recently-reported cases were residents of other counties and their cases were transferred to the appropriate health departments. Thus, the total number of cases is 55 more than yesterday. Therefore, since the start of the pandemic, the total number of confirmed COVID-19 cases in Macon County residents is 6,941. Please acknowledge that every person affected by this pandemic is a human being with family, friends, and a future that is changed by COVID-19. It is up to every single member of this community to do EVERYTHING that they can do prevent the spread of this virus and the consequences associated.
