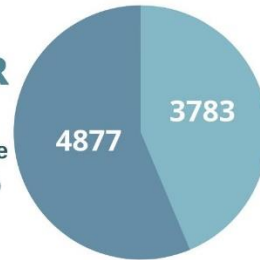

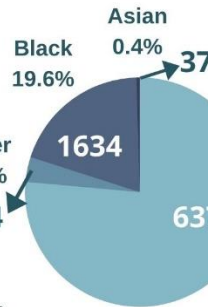

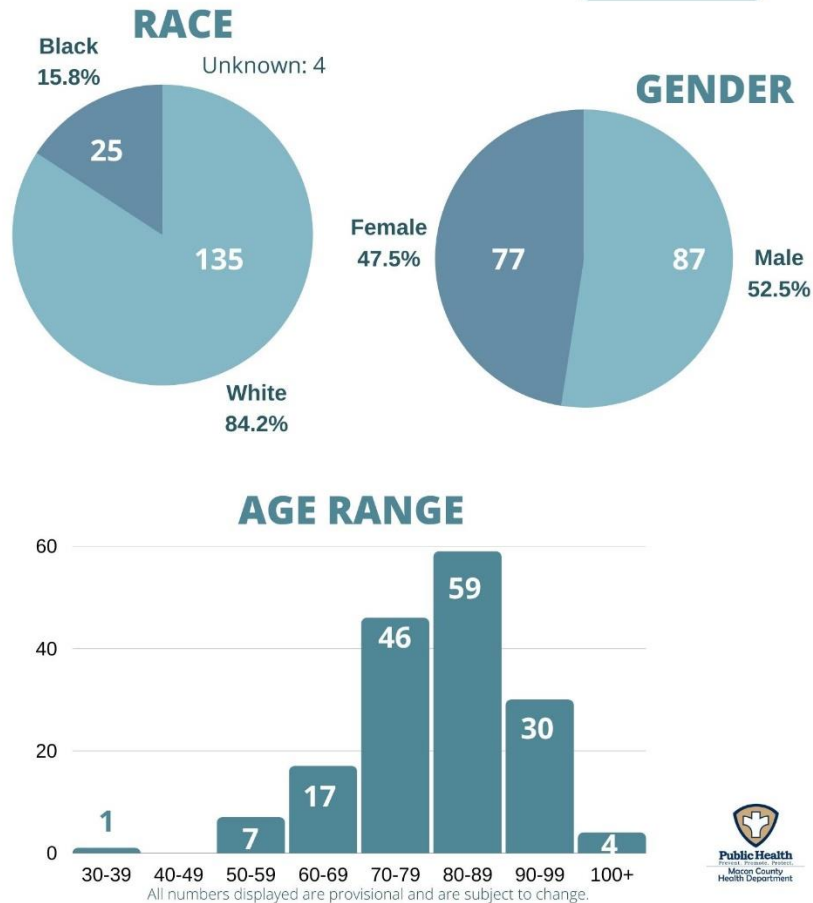

It is with great sadness that we, the Joint Crisis Communication Team, must announce the passing of a Macon County resident with COVID-19. This person was a male in his 80s, and we ask that you please respect the privacy of his family and friends as they mourn their significant loss.

Today, the Joint CCT is reporting 40 newly-confirmed cases of COVID-19. Therefore, since the start of the pandemic, the total number of confirmed COVID-19 cases in Macon County residents is 8,666. Please acknowledge that every person affected by this pandemic is a human being with family, friends, and a future that is changed by COVID-19. It is up to every single member of this community to do EVERYTHING that they can do prevent the spread of this virus and the consequences associated.
