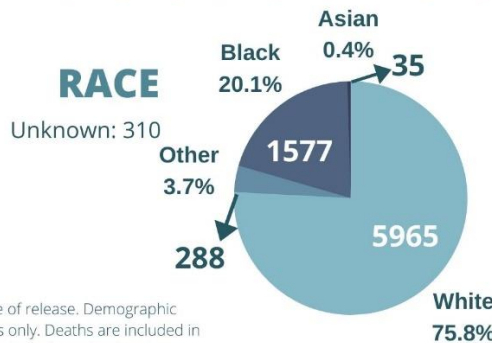

Today, the Joint CCT is reporting 49 newly-confirmed cases of COVID-19 since January 2, 2021. On Sunday, January 3rd, there were 27 new cases of COVID-19 and today, January 4th, we have 22 new cases. Therefore, since the start of the pandemic, the total number of confirmed COVID-19 cases in Macon County residents is 8,175. Please acknowledge that every person affected by this pandemic is a human being with family, friends, and a future that is changed by COVID-19. It is up to every single member of this community to do EVERYTHING that they can do prevent the spread of this virus and the consequences associated.

As of Monday, January 4, 2021, there have been over 2,500 people vaccinated in Macon County. Vaccines continue to be administered to eligible parties on a regular basis as vaccine is available. Vaccinations will be administered according to the ACIP, CDC, and IDPH guidelines and phases developed. As additional clinics are scheduled, the community will be informed when appropriate.

Do not show up at a hospital emergency room or doctor's office unless it is a true emergency.
