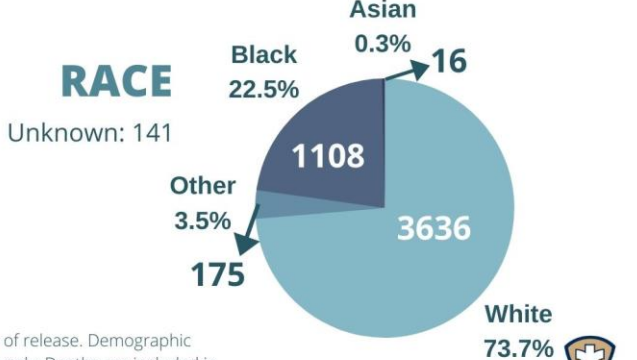
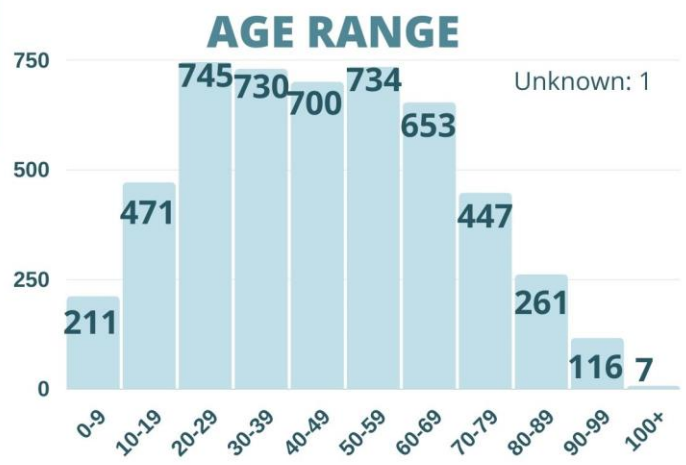
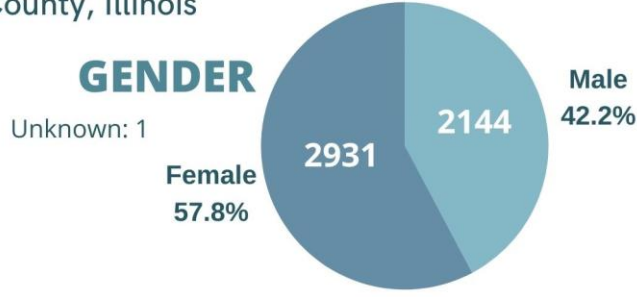

The Joint Crisis Communication Team is saddened to share the news of the passing of five Macon County residents with COVID-19. Two of these residents were females – one in her 70s and one in her 80s. Three of these residents were males – one in his 70s and two others in their 80s. Our team extends our sincere condolences to the families and friends of these people, and we ask that they are given the respect and privacy they deserve as they mourn their incredible losses.

Today, the Joint CCT is reporting 131 newly-confirmed cases of COVID-19. Therefore, since the start of the pandemic, the total number of confirmed COVID-19 cases in Macon County residents is 5,076. Please acknowledge that every person affected by this pandemic is a human being with family, friends, and a future that is changed by COVID-19. It is up to every single member of this community to do EVERYTHING that they can do prevent the spread of this virus and the consequences associated.
