### Crisis Communication Team Press Update

As of today's release, the Joint Crisis Communication Team (CCT) reports the following numbers:





All numbers reflect status at time of release. Demographic information reflects confirmed cases only. Deaths are included in the number of confirmed cases. All numbers displayed are provisional and are subject to change.



Today, the Joint CCT is reporting 70 newly-confirmed cases of COVID-19 since Friday's report. On Saturday, January 23<sup>rd</sup>, there were 27 new cases of COVID-19 and on Sunday, January 24<sup>th</sup>, there were 18 new cases of COVID-19. Today, January 25<sup>th</sup> there are 25 new cases of COVID-19. Please note that while there are 70 newly-confirmed cases since Friday, through case investigations, it was determined that 1 previously-reported case was a resident of another county and transferred to the appropriate health department. Therefore, since the start of the pandemic, the total number of confirmed COVID-19 cases in Macon County residents is 9,092. Please acknowledge that every person affected by this pandemic is a human being with family, friends, and a future that is changed by COVID-19. It is up to every single member of this community to do EVERYTHING that they can do prevent the spread of this virus and the consequences associated.

  - Monday- Friday, 8:00 a.m.- noon (appointments are strongly encouraged, but not required)
